

School-Connect 4.0 Alignment with Pennsylvania's Academic Standards for Career Education and Work

Pennsylvania's Career Education and Work standards reflect the increasing complexity and sophistication that students experience as they progress through school, focusing on the skills and continuous learning and innovation required for students to succeed in a rapidly changing workplace. The standards are built around the concepts of career awareness and exploration, employability skills, growth and advancement, and personal interests and career planning.

NOTE: Many lessons include multiple competencies used simultaneously (e.g., self-awareness & self-management) and are therefore listed more than once.
